JULY 2014

MPA released the Fishermans Bend Strategic Framework Plan (SFP)

FEB-APR 2015

City of Melbourne engaged with the community on the draft Lorimer Structure Plan through community information sessions and via the City of Melbourne's Participate Melbourne portal.

APR 2015

City of Melbourne has collated input from over 70 responses and is preparing a Community Engagement summary report (due early May 2015)

17 APR 2015

Minister for Planning announced a review of existing Fishermans Bend SFP to accommodate an additional 205ha employment precinct and recasting of the plan into distinct neighbourhoods.

PRIMARY THEMES

FROM STAGE 1 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT


- Need for comprehensive traffic management and public transport infrastructure
- Need for intensity and mix of land uses and housing diversity
- Need for public open space diversity and connectivity
- General support for increased density but need for managing development transition with interfaces of established uses and adjacent precincts

KEY AREAS OF CONCERN

- Buildings will be predominantly towers with podiums (based on the first four applications), and the precinct could end up looking like Southbank
- Increasing density will compound existing congestion for vehicle movements - cars and freight
- Public transport provision will be insufficient and not adequately networked or multi-modal
- Collins Street extension with bridge over Yarra will impact the amenity of Yarra's Edge (opinion on this topic was quite divided)
- Community infrastructure provision up-front will be inadequate, especially schools, as neighbouring facilities are at or beyond capacity
- Project governance will not deliver on the vision, highlighting phasing of development as a key concern, and the community's input not being heard





- URBAN STRUCTURE AND BUILT FORM








