This book is written by the City of Melbourne.




This book is about our **Disability Access Plan**.



Our Disability Access Plan says how we will make things better for people with disability.


We will call it our plan.

1. Everyone has good access around Melbourne.






2. Everyone can access our information, services and events.

We will


- make sure access is part of our building plans

We will


• employ more people with disability
