ARDEN RENEWAL PRECINCT

Overview of Arden

Arden is a 50 hectare precinct incorporating part of the existing suburb of North Melbourne that is designated for 'urban renewal' around the Metro Tunnel's new Arden Station (to open by 2025). It is bounded by Macaulay Road, the Moonee Ponds Creek and Dryburgh Street and aspires to accommodate approximately 34,000 jobs and be home to around 15,000 residents over the coming decades.

The vision is for Arden to evolve into a thriving mixed use neighbourhood and a magnet for innovative science, health, digital technology and education industries.

Arden will be a great place to live and work with lively streets and open spaces, a range of housing choices, new schools and community hubs.

Arden currently comprises a mix of residential, commercial and industrial uses across different character areas. It is known as the home of the North Melbourne Football Club, the North Melbourne Pool, and the tall flour mill silos visible from CityLink.
